

# Declaration

Homestead of  
Bridget Kavanaugh

Know all men by these presents that I Bridget Kavanaugh, wife of William Kavanaugh of Eureka, Eureka County, State of Nevada intend to claim and hold as a homestead under and by virtue of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada entitled "An Act to exempt the homestead and other property from forced sale in certain cases approved March 27th 1873" the following described real property to wit: That certain piece and parcel of land situated lying and being on King Hill near Eureka in said County and State between the Richmond and Eureka Consolidated Mining Companies Mines and the premises hereunto appertaining hereunto being or in any-wise appertaining the same heretofore occupied by myself and husband as a boarding house and known as Kavanaugh's Boarding house that I have never abandoned my right to hold and claim said property as aforesaid and that I now intend to claim and use said property as a homestead
