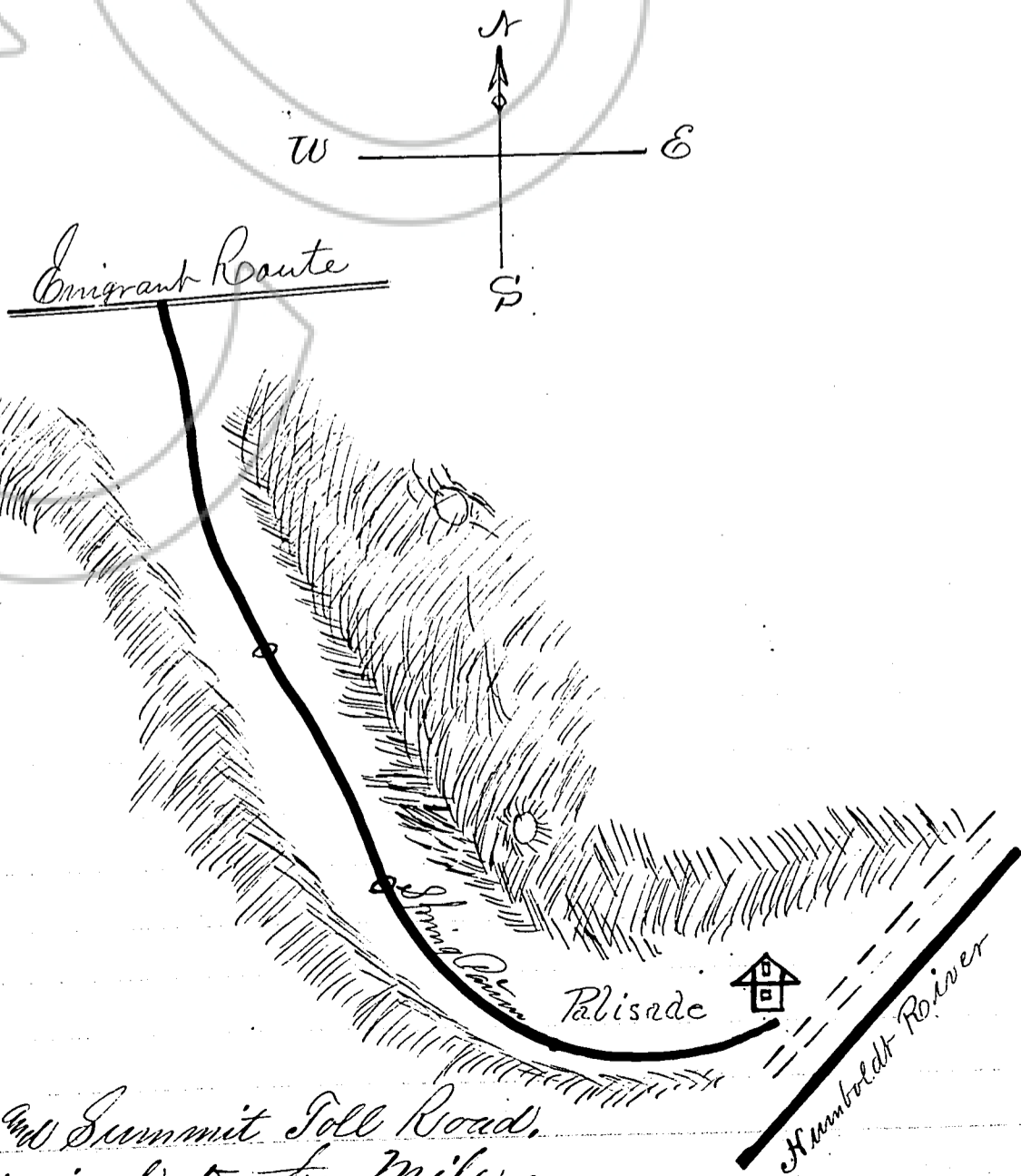


Toll Road. Location of.

Palisade Nov 20th 1873  
 We W. E. Griffin and J. B. Tolley do hereby certify that it is our desire and intention to construct and maintain a Toll Road in the County of Carson State of Nevada commencing at a point about one half mile West of the town of Palisade and running in a Northwesterly direction up Spring Canyon to the summit and thence to old Emigrant Route. Said road being about six miles long from point of beginning to said Emigrant Road as shown by the plat attached and made a part hereof. The name of said road shall be The Palisade and Summit Toll Road and this franchise is claimed under and by virtue of the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada entitled an act to provide for Constructing and maintaining Toll Roads and Bridges in the State of Nevada. Approved March 8th 1865.
