Whereas, We William Vermuth
and J D Farmer of the town of
Eureka, in the State of Nevada, but
now here, have this day sold and

conveyed to the Hoosac Consolidated Gold and Silver Mining
Company, a corporation formed under the laws of the State
of New York the Hoosac Smelting Works in said town of
Eureka, and the Dolly Varden and Hoosac Mines located
on Hoosac Mountain in the Eureka Mining District in said
State of Nevada, and whereas we are the owners and holders
and have the exclusive right to use a road bed or Avenue
about one and one quarter miles in length and running

from the Hoosac mines to the county road between Enckatown and Secret Cañon And whereas we are also the owners and holders of various goods wares merchandise railroad tracks cars, hoisting apparatus, blacksmith shop and tools miners cabins, picks, shovels, bars, used in and about said smelting works and mines which are not conveyed by the deed to said Hoosac Consolidated Gold and Silver mining company

And whereas in selling and conveying said Smelting works and said mines we have sold and intend to convey to said Hoosac Consolidated Gold and Silver Mining Company all and singular the tools, implements apparatus railroad tracks, cars, road beds, fixtures and personal property which we have heretofore used in and about the working of said Smelting works or mines or which in any way appertain thereto

Now therefore in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to us in hand paid and of other valuable considerations receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged we hereby sell, assign transfer and set over unto said Hoosac Consolidated Gold and Silver Mining Company all and singular our right title and interest in said road bed and the absolute ownership or fee in and to all and singular said rail, track, cars, tools, implements, blacksmith shop, miners cabins, fixtures personal property or things whether at said smelting works or mines or elsewhere which belong to us and which we have heretofore used in and about the working of said Smelting works or mines or which in any way appertain thereto.
