Lease.

This Indenture made the Thirty-first day of January  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and eighty, Between Eureka Lodge No. 22. of the  
Independent Order of Odd Fellows of Nevada, at  
Eureka, Eureka County in said State, by and through  
its Trustees Charles S. Brog, Peij. C. Levy and Morris Galish all of the  
same place, hereunto duly authorized by the said Eureka Lodge No. 22 a-  
foresaid by resolution dated December 4th 1879, to wit: "The Trustees are  
authorized to consult and make arrangements with the Trustees of other  
organizations for the purpose of securing their tenancy of the new hall in  
the Foley and Rickard Building," the party of the first part, and Eureka  
Lodge No. 16. Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Nevada, by and  
through its Trustees, Hiram Johnson, G. H. Barklin and W. W. Bishop,  
all of Eureka aforesaid, hereunto duly authorized by the said Eureka Lodge  
No. 16. I. & A. M. aforesaid, by resolution dated December 22nd A. D. 1879, to  
wit: "Upon motion the trustees were empowered to rent the hall in the Foley  
and Rickard Building for all the Saturday nights in each and every month  
for the term of three years with a privilege of three years thereafter and the  
rent not to exceed the sum of Fifty Dollars per month," the party of the  
second part; Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part has letten,  
and by these presents does grant, demise and let unto the said party of  
the second part, all the following described premises to wit: Those four  
cario. rooms in the new brick building in the town of Eureka, Neva-  
da now being in course of completion and owned by M. D. Foley and  
R. Rickard and by them let and demise unto the said party of the  
first part and described in a Lease bearing date December 20th 1879,  
and duly recorded in the Office of the County Recorder of Eureka

County Nevada, in Libro "A" of "Miscellaneous" on Pages 631, 632 & 633, on each and every Saturday for the term of three years from the tenth day of February A.D. 1880, or as soon thereafter as the said premises shall be ready for occupancy, at the yearly rent of Six Hundred Dollars in U.S. Gold coin, to be paid in monthly payments of Fifty Dollars, monthly in advance. And it is agreed that if the said rent, or any part thereof shall be due and unpaid, or if default shall be made in any of the covenants herein contained, then it shall be lawful for the said party of the first part to re-enter the said premises and to remove all persons therefrom. And the said party of the first part hereby further agrees to furnish said Hall and keep it furnished during the term of this Lease in a comfortable manner, and to keep the same in good order and furnish all wood and lights required. And the said party of the second part doth covenant to pay to the said party of the first part, the said yearly rent as herein specified namely in monthly payments in advance as aforesaid during the said term of three years. And that at the expiration of said term, the said party of the second part will quit and surrender the premises hereby demised in as good state and condition as reasonable use and wear thereof will permit, damages by the elements excepted. It is however expressly stipulated by and between the parties hereto, that in case the said premises should be destroyed in whole or in part by fire or the Act of God, then and in that event the rent herein specified shall cease, until the premises aforesaid shall become again tenable during the term of this Lease. And the said party of the second part hereby agrees not to let or underlet the said premises or any part thereof, except to other Masonic bodies or Lodges. And the said party of the first part does covenant that the said party of the second part, on paying the said yearly rent in the manner aforesaid, shall and may peaceably and quietly have, hold and enjoy the said demised premises for the term aforesaid. And the said party of the first part further covenants to and with the said party of the second part, that in the event that the said party of the first part shall have a renewal of its Lease of the said Hall for the term of three years after the expiration thereof, then in such case the said party of the second part shall have the privilege of renewing this Lease for the term of three years after the expiration thereof, upon the same terms and conditions as contained therein. And it is hereby further understood by and between the parties hereto, that these presents shall bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto.
