James S. McKenney | Know all Men by these Presents, That I William Whalen  
 James S. McKenney | of the County of Eureka and State of Nevada am held  
 and firmly bound unto James S. McKenney of Chicago  
 Illinois, or his assigns in the sum of Five hundred thousand Dollars law-  
 ful money of the United States, for the payment of which sum, well and truly to  
 be made, I hereby bind myself heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, firmly  
 by these presents. Witness my hand and seal this Fifteenth day of June A.D. 1880  
 The Conditions of The Above Obligation are such, that, whereas, the above bounden  
 William Whalen has, on the day of the date hereof, agreed to sell to the said James  
 S. McKenney the following described property, lying, being and situate in the  
 County of Eureka and State of Nevada, to wit: Three mining claims known as  
 the Cumberland Congress and Bennett, located in the Antelope Mining dis-  
 trict in the County of Eureka and State of Nevada. The said James S. McKenney  
 or his Assigns to have full authority to examine and develope said property at  
 his or his Assigns own proper cost during the pendency of this Bond. If proceeds  
 of Mine shall more than pay expenses, such surplus in case of failure on the part  
 of said McKenney to be refunded to said Whalen. If at the expiration of four  
 months said McKenney has received subscriptions for one half of said Two  
 hundred and fifty thousand dollars, Then and in such event he or his assigns  
 shall have a deed for half of said Mining claims, and an extension of two  
 months on the remaining half. If the mines do not come up to representations  
 as per said Whalens written statement hereto attached the time and expense  
 of A J. Bell for examining the mines above described shall be a bill on them  
 to the amount of One thousand dollars, said Bell to be allowed to make such  
 tests as he may deem proper in the examination of the property, in Antelope  
 Mining District, for the sum of Two hundred & fifty thousand Dollars, lawful  
 money, which sum of money is to be paid to the said William Whalen as herein-  
 before stated or deposited to the credit of William Whalen in the Banking house  
 of the First National Bank in the City of Chicago, Ill or or before the Fif-  
 teenth day of October A.D. 1880 or as herein before provided and the said  
 William Whalen shall, on the Fifteenth day of October A.D. 1880, or at any  
 time before, on the payment of the said sum of Two hundred and fifty  
 Thousand Dollars, so to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned, make, execute,  
 acknowledge and deliver unto the said James S. McKenney or to such  
 person or persons, as he shall designate, a good and sufficient deed or deeds  
 of all the foregoing property, showing a clear and perfect title, free from all  
 incumbrances (except as against the United States). Now, if the said  
 James S. McKenney shall fail to pay the said sum of money at the time  
 aforesaid, and if the said William Whalen shall well and faithfully per-  
 form the covenants herein, then this obligation to be null and void, otherwise  
 to remain in full force and effect.
