Locality Notice

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned having conferred with the  
United States and local laws and regulations, hereby locate fifty (50) feet  
(50m) lines of surface on the land, ledge or deposit of minerals bearing scoria and  
rocks and claim all valuable minerals contained therein together with  
the surface (50m) feet on each side from a center line through an  
surface ground, emanating at this notice and monument and naming  
Oswald (1000) feet more or less and five hundred feet more or less and  
described as follows: This monument being about 1500 feet south  
westward from the No 1 incline shaft of the New York mine, this mine  
is on the western slope of Ferguson Mountain near Cornsboro Course  
and is a re-locating of the Cornstock mine (as recorded in 1886) and  
shall be known as the New York Mine. Located this twenty eighth day  
of October 1891 in Schroeder Mining District Cornsboro Nevada
