

Democrat Mine

Notice is hereby given that I the undersigned claims fifteen hundred feet linear measure, as this low course of gold and silver bearing quartz emanating at the north and on our west and running north westerly therefrom along the line of the low a distance of Seven hundred and fifty feet to a monument made of a stake and stone and south westerly along the line of said low a distance of Seven hundred and fifty feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, with the dip spurs and angles of said low, together with the surface ground on each side of said low bounded and described as follows to wit commencing at the monument last named and running south westerly therefrom at a right angle with the general direction of said low three hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, then at a right angle north westerly fifteen hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, then at a right angle westerly six hundred feet to a monument of a stake and stone then at a right angle south westerly fifteen hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone and then at a right angle easterly three hundred to the place of beginning. This claim is located on the Bull dog low and is bounded on the south by the northern boundary of the Bull dog mine, said claim shall be called the Democrat mine and is located under and by virtue of the mining laws of Congress of the United States, and the laws of richmond mining District, Carsona County, State of Nevada.
