Notice is hereby given that the undersigned claim fifteen hundred linear feet measured on this lode a series of gold and silver bearing quartz, commencing at this notice and monument and running westerly, thence from along the line of the lode a distance of seven hundred and fifty feet to a monument made of a stake and stone and thence southerly along the line of said lode a distance of seven hundred and fifty feet to a monument made of a stake and stone with the dips shown and angles of said lode together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows to wit; commencing at the monument last named and running westerly thence from, at a right angle with the general direction of said lode three hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, thence at a right angle northerly fifteen hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, thence at a right angle westerly six hundred feet to monument made of a stake and stone, thence at a right angle southerly fifteen hundred feet to a monument made of a stake and stone, and thence at a right angle easterly three hundred feet to the place of beginning.
