This *Lead*, made on April 7th, 1911, by
 Central Pacific Railway Company, a corporation of the
 State of Utah, first party, and Central Trust Company
 of New York, a corporation of the State of New York,
 as trustee under Mortgage on *Lead* of Trust
 to it from said Central Pacific Railway Company,
 dated August 1, 1899, second party, and United States
 Trust Company of New York, a corporation of the
 State of New York, as trustee under Mortgage on
Lead of Trust to it from said Central Pacific
 Railway Company, dated August 1, 1899, third party,
 unto Humboldt Land and Cattle Company, a

Corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, fourth party.

Witnesseth: That in consideration of One (\$1,000) dollar paid to first party, receipt whereof is acknowledged, first party hereby remises, releases and quitclaims, and second and third parties release unto fourth party, its successors and assigns, all right, title and interest they, or either of them, now have or hold in and to the following described land situated in the County of Elko, State of Nevada, which in the judgment of second and third parties is not necessary for, or for use in connection with, the railway of first party, to wit: That certain right of way granted to Central Pacific Railroad Company of California (of which the first party unto is the successor), by Section 2 of the act of Congress, approved July 1, 1862, (12. Stats. 489) to the extent of two hundred (200) feet in width on each side of said railroad, as the same was originally surveyed, located and constructed; to the extent that the same was on or about December 31, 1902, abandoned by said first party in consequence of the relocation and construction of its railroad elsewhere, and more particularly described as follows, to wit: Commencing at the intersection of said abandoned right of way with the north boundary line of the Southeast Quarter (S.E. 1/4) of Section One (1), in Township Thirty-two (32) North, of Range Forty-eight (48) East, and continuing to the intersection of said abandoned right of way with the Southeast Quarter (S.E. 1/4) of Section Thirty-one (31), in Township Thirty-two (32) North, of Range Forty-nine (49) East; also commencing at the intersection of said abandoned right of way with the west boundary line of Section Ten (10), in Township Thirty-one (31) North, of Range Forty-nine (49) East, and continuing to the intersection of said abandoned right of way with the east boundary line of the Southeast Quarter (S.E. 1/4) of Section Twelve (12), in Township Thirty-one (31) North, of Range Forty-nine (49) East, all of

Mount Diablo Base and Meridian:
together with all rights, privileges and appurtenances
thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining.
Excepting and reserving any portion of said
abandoned right of way lying within two hundred
(200) feet of the center line of Central Pacific Railway
Company's railroad as now relocated and constructed;
also excepting and reserving that portion of said
abandoned right of way lying and being in
Northwest Quarter of Northeast Quarter. N.W. 1/4 of NE. 1/4 of
Section sixteen (16), in Township thirty-two (32) North,
of Range forty-eight (48) East, Mount Diablo, Base
and Meridian.

To Have and to Hold the said premises, with the
appurtenances, unto the party, its successors and
assigns forever: freed and discharged from the liens,
powers and trusts of the said Trust deeds given
by first party to second and third parties, respectfully,
on August 1, 1899, as aforesaid.

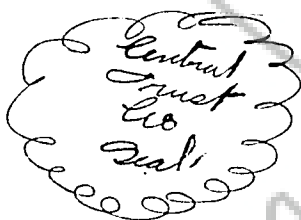
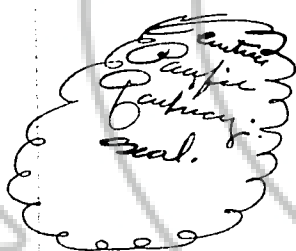
