TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

The CENTRAL PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, a Corporation existing under the laws of the State of California, and of the United States, and the METROPOLITAN TRUST COMPANY OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK, a corporation existing under the laws of the State of New York, Trustee under the Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust from the said Central Pacific Railroad Company to CHARLES CROCKER and SILAS W. SANDERSON, Trustees, dated 1st October, 1870, and Trustee under the Indenture dated 4th September, 1890, between the said Central Pacific Railroad Company, J.O'B. Gunn and William E. Brown, heretofore Trustees under said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust of 1st October, 1870, and the Southern Pacific Company, in respect to the extension of Bonds, secured by the said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust of 1st October, 1870, send Greeting:-

WHEREAS, in and by said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust of 1st October, 1870, it was provided that all the lands therein conveyed and mortgaged should be under the sole and exclusive management and control of the said Central Pacific Railroad Company, with full power and authority in it to make contracts for the sale of the same, at such price, on such credit or terms of payment, and upon such other conditions as should be agreed to by the parties of the first and second part to the said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust, and as should seem to the said parties best calculated to secure a payment in full of all the Bonds issued as therein provided, until entry or forclosure by the Trustees, as therein provided;

AND THEREAS, the said Central Pacific Railroad Company has contracted for the sale of the land hereinafter described to Thomas Griffin for the sum of Six hundred and forty (640) Dollars, and such contract for the sale of said land, at the price and upon the credit or terms of payment and conditions contracted for, has been agreed to be the said Central Pacific Railroad Company and Metropolitan Trust Company of the City of New York, to which Companies it has seemed best calculated to secure the payment in full of all the Bonds issued, as in said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust provided:

AND WHEREAS, the whole of the purchase money of said land has been paid to the Metropolitan Trust Company of the City of New York, in cash, or in Bonds secured by the said Indenture of Mortgage or Deed of Trust, or in overdue Coupons:

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and the said sum of Six hundred and forty (640) Dollars, the receipt whereof in cash, or in such Bonds or Coupons, is hereby acknowledged, the said Central Pacific Railroad Company, and the said Metropolitan Trust Company of the City of New York, Trustee upon the trusts expressed in the Indenture hereinbefore mentioned, have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said Thomas Griffin and his heirs and assigns, the following described tract of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Eureka, State of Nevada, towit:- The North half (Ni) of Section Seventeen (17), in Township Thirty-one (31) North, of Range Fifty (50) East Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, containing Three Hundred and twenty (320) acres, according to the United States surveys, together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto appertaining and belonging.

Excepting and reserving however, for Railroad purposes, a strip of land four hundred feet wide, lying equally on each side of the track of the Railroad of said Company, or any branch Railroad now or hereafter constructed on said lands, and the right to use all water needed for the operating and repairing of said Railroad which rises on said land, and the right of way to conduct water rising on other lands across said land in pipes or aqueducts for said purposes; and subject also to the reservation and condition that the said purchaser his heirs and assigns, shall erect and maintain good and sufficient fences on both sides of said strip or strips of land; and reserving all claim of the United States to the same as mineral land.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforesaid premises to the said Thomas Griffin heirs and assigns to his and their use and behoof forever.
