

President Roosevelt signed the senate bill which makes it unnecessary for holders of mining claims to perform annual assessment work for the year ending at noon on July 1. The law provides that claim owners who paid income tax for the year 1935 are not exempt. The law also provides that notice must be filed with the county recorder of the county in which the claims are located showing that the claim owner desires to hold the claim under the provisions of the congressional act. The form below can be used by claim owners in filing their notice of ownership and suspension of labor.

desire to hold the above-mentioned claim.

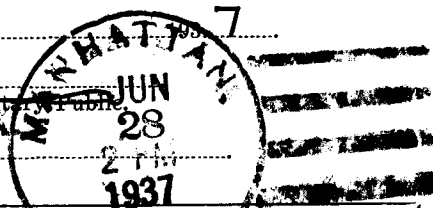

NOTE: Not more than six Lode Mining Claims held by the same person, and not more than twelve Lode Mining Claims held by the same partnership, association, or corporation, and not more than six Placer Mining Claims, not to exceed 120 acres in all held by the same person, and not more than 12 Placer Mining Claims not to exceed 240 acres in all held by the same partnership, association, or corporation may be held under the provisions of the aforesaid act suspending the requirement for the performance of annual labor or making improvements on unpatented Mining Claims as required by law.
