NOTE: The moratorium covers all mining claims, lode or placer, regardless of the number claimed or the type of claimant—individual, partnership, company or corporation. Previous moratoriums have limited the number of claims individuals or joint claimants could hold without performance of assessment work: usually six for individuals and 12 for joint or corporation holding. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT "NOTICE OF OWNERSHIP AND SUSPENSION OF LABOR" FORMS SHOULD BE FILED EACH YEAR, REGARDLESS OF THE FACT THAT THE ACT CONTINUES FOR THE DURATION OF THE WAR.
