

Certificate of Location

(LODE CLAIM*)

THIS IS TO CERTIFY THAT the Thursday No. 2 lode mining claim was located by Jackson Mountain Mining Company, whose post office address appears below, on the 23rd day of July, 1964.

The general course of said lode or vein is easterly and westerly

The claim is situated in the Mineral Hill Mining District, Eureka County, State of Nevada, and joins the Thursday claim to the south

The locator claim is 750 feet in a (n) easterly direction and 750 feet in a (n) westerly direction from the point of discovery, with a width of 300 feet on each side of the center of the vein or lode along the entire length of said claim.

The dimensions and locations of the discovery work done on the claim are as follows:
a cut 2 feet deep, 20 feet wide and 150 feet long located 400 feet east of the location marker on Thursday No. 5

The total cost of such work consisted of at least \$ \$600.00

The corners and side centers of the claim are located and marked as follows:
with posts labeled Thursday No. 2 on each corner and one in the center of each side line and each designated NW, NE, SE, SW or side center as applicable

Each of the above-described monuments is 1 a post at least 4 inches in diameter, 4 1/2 feet long and set at least 1 foot deep in the ground
