EDMOND F. LAWRENCE, first being duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am familiar with those contiguous mining claims situate in the Cortez Mining District, Eureka County, Nevada, known and designated as the Poorman and New York mining claims, and do make this affidavit on behalf of John Scott, the owner thereof.

For and with respect to the assessment year September 1, 1963, to September 1, 1964, there was performed on each of the said claims at least \$100.00 worth of labor, said work having a total value in excess of \$200.00. Such work was performed during the period from September 10, 1963 to September 1, 1964.

Such work performed and improvements made included the following viz: road work around camp on the Poorman claim and on the access road, and geo-chemical surveys consisting of further soil sampling for copper, lead, zinc, and mercury.

The basic findings from such surveys were: (1) copper, lead, and zinc are anomalous over the veins, but are quite low in the surrounding country rock, (2) mercury is anomalous over the same areas as the lead, (3) mercury halos might be used to advantage here for prospecting for lead-silver.

Such work and improvements were made or performed by Edmond F. Lawrence, Mining Geologist, at the instance of John Scott, the owner thereof, and for his benefit only, and was gratuitously contributed by each of the parties involved because John Scott was incapacitated due to ill health throughout the year. Edmond F. Lawrence was assisted by J. D. Quick, Floyd Petersen, Roy Crain, and D.P. Ward, none of which have any interest or ownership in said claims.

Edmond F. Lawrence is a mining geologist, holding a B. S. degree in geology from the University of Alabama, and with four years of graduate work in geology at the University of California at Los Angeles, and is a Registered Professional Engineer, Geological, Nevada No. 1133. His experience includes six years with the Anaconda Company and the Idaho Maryland Mines Company, as a mining geologist, six years with Nevada Bureau of Mines as a mining geologist, and 3½ years as a consulting mining geologist.
