ROBERT L. REDMOND, first before duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am familiar with these contiguous mining claims situate in the Fourmile Canyon Area, Certos Range, Certos Mining District, Eureka County, Nevada, known and designated as the Ima, Falcon and Pat claim groups. I through 13, 16, Falcon Nos. 19 through 44, Ima Nos. 10 through 40, Pat Nos. 1 through 79, and do make this affidavit on behalf of Martel Mining Company, the owner thereof.

Per and with respect to the assessment year September 1, 1964, to September 1, 1965, there was performed, or made, or for the benefit of each of the said claims, at least \$100.00 worth of labor, said work having a total value in excess of \$12,000.00. Such work was done during the period from September 3, 1964 through August 23, 1965.

Such work performed and improvements made included the following: Geological, geochemical and geophysical work in September 1964 and from May 1 through August 23, 1965. This work consisted of Induced Polarisation Surveys in the Fourmile Canyon on the Ima, Falcon and Pat claim groups; geochemical sampling on the Ima, Falcon and Pat Claim groups for copper, molybdenum mineralisation; mapping and geochemical sampling on the Ima, Falcon and Pat Claim groups for copper, lead and zinc mineralization; geochemical sampling on the Sugarleaf-Willow Creek-Hornes Canyon area covered by the Pat Claims, for mercury halo surveys; detailed mapping of the geologic structure in the Fourmile-Sugarleaf-Mill Canyon areas to delineate the vein and fault patterns; further petrological studies covering all claim groups.

The basic findings from such work included: (1) An Induced Polarisation anomaly in the Moly Spring area appears to be near surface and in the same general area as the Self-Potential anomaly reported in 1964. (2) Confirmation of hydro-geochemical anomaly for molybdenum in Fourmile Canyon. (3) Mercury was found to be anomalous on the southern slope of Sugarleaf towards the Ressi property. (4) Further mapping of geologic structure in Fourmile Canyon indicates a strong NNE shear zone that may account for part of the Magnetic anomalies and part of the mineralization.

Such work and improvements were performed or made at the instance of and for the benefit of and at the expense of MARTEL MINING COMPANY, pursuant to its contractual obligations with respect to such claims. Such work was performed under the general supervision of ROBERT L. REDMOND, geologist, assisted by EDMUND F. LAWRENCE, E.L.STEPHENSON, HELEN E. LAWRENCE, AND OTHERS. Edmund F. Lawrence is a Consultant Mining Geologist, and E.L.Stephenson is a Consultant Geophysicist and geologist. The above geological, geochemical, and geophysical work was not repetitive of previous surveys.

Robert L. Redmond is a graduate geologist with 15 years experience in exploration and development of mining properties and is the General Manager of Martel Mining Company.

which will be followed by a period of time during which the

(1) An individual may file a complaint against another individual or entity if they believe that the other individual or entity has violated their civil rights under Title VI. The complainant must file a written complaint with the Office of Civil Rights within 180 days of the alleged violation. The Office of Civil Rights will then review the complaint and determine whether there is sufficient evidence to support a finding of discrimination. If a finding of discrimination is made, the Office of Civil Rights will issue a notice of proposed findings and provide the respondent with an opportunity to respond. The Office of Civil Rights will then issue a final decision.
