I am familiar with those certain contiguous mining claims situate in the Cortex Mining District, Eureka County, State of Nevada, known and designated as the Blue Bell, Elue Jay, Bruno, Cavalier, Cortes, Cortes No. 1, Cortes No. 2, Cortes No. 3, Cortes No. 4, Cortez No. 5, Fagle, Erwin, Esther, Clittering Galore, Josephine, London, Majestic, Majestic No. 1, Mascot, Number 10, Number 11, Oneonton, Shamrock, Tom Gillan, Valley View, Nora, Highland Lassie, Norman, Helen, Helen No. 1, Helen No. 2, Buddy, Shiela, Esther B., and Whitney, and do make this affidavit on the behalf of Ray Nelson, the owner of a undivided ene-third interest in the above claims.

For and with respect to the assessment year September 1, 1964, to September 1, 1965, there was performed, or made on, or for the benefit of each of the said claims at least (\$100.00 X 1/3) \$33.34 worth of labor, said work having a total value in in excess of \$1,170.00. Such work was done in the period between September 5, 1966, and April 20 1065. and April 28, 1965, and May 1, 1965 to August 31, 1965.

Such work performed included the following: geological and geochemical surveys including geological mapping of the area west of Mill Canyon and soil and rock sampling for geochemical surveys, such samples being geochemically analyzed for copper, lead, zinc, and/or mercury.

The basic findings from such surveys were: (1) extension of previous anomalies, (2) mercury appears to be anomalous over and in the vicinity of the Cortes stock, (3) Mercury appears to be anomalous over the leadysilver veins in the north end of Mill Canyon, and (4) mercury might be useful in exploration for further ore-shoots

Such work was performed by Edmond F. Lawrence, Mining Geologist, at the instance and expenses of Ray Nelson, the owner of a undivided one-third interest in said claims, in compliance with the agreement dated June 14, 1963, between Ray Helson and Helson and Allen Russell. The work was done for the benefit of Ray Welson, and entrance on the property was by written permission from Ray Nelson, in accordance with said agreement. Edmond F. Lawrence was assisted in the work by Helen J. Lawrence, Ray Nelson, and others.

Edmond F. Lawrence is a mining geologist, holding a B. S. degree in geology from the University of Alabama, and with four years of graduate work in geology at the University of California at Los Angeles, and is a Registered Professional Engineer, Nevada No. 1133. His experience includes six years as a mining geologist for the Anaconda Company and the Idaho Maryland Mines Company, six years as a mining geologist for the Nevada Bureau of Mines, and four years as a consulting mining geologist.
