To all to whom these Presents shall come, greeting.

Whereas, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States the plat and field notes of survey of the Well Site of the

Phoenix Silver Mining Company

accompanied by the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Eureka in the State of Nevada, whereby it appears that in pursuance of the said Revised Statutes of the United States, the said

Phoenix Silver Mining Company

did on the twenty-sixth day of March A. D. 1879, enter and pay for said claim or premises, being Mineral Entry number four hundred and five (405) in the series of said office, designated by the Surveyor General as Lot number one hundred and forty-three (143) embracing a portion of the unsurveyed public domain, in the Eureka Mining District, in the county of Eureka, and State of Nevada, in the district of lands, subject to sale at Eureka, containing five (5) acres of land, more or less, and, according to the returns on file in the General Land Office,

bounded, described and platted as follows, with magnetic variation at sixteen (16) degrees thirty (30) minutes East to wit:

Beginning at Corner N^o 1, a Post marked "N^o 1 U.S. Survey N^o 143," the same being Post N^o 1 of Survey N^o 116, patented to the Phoenix Silver Mining Company with its claim upon the Adams & Farrer & Deep Lode, from which the Flagstaff in the Town of Eureka bears North fifty-three (53) degrees thirteen (13) minutes East, at the distance of ninety-two hundred and ninety-five (9295) feet, Ruby Hill N^o 1 bears North sixty-two (62) degrees eleven (11) minutes West, at the distance of eighteen hundred and fifty-seven (857) feet, the Lawson Shaft of the Eureka Consolidated Mining Company bears North fifty (50) degrees thirty-seven (37) minutes West, at the distance of eight hundred and fourteen and eight tenths ($814 \frac{8}{10}$) feet, and the Phoenix Shaft bears South eighteen (18) degrees East at the distance of two hundred and eighty-two (282) feet. Thence from said Corner N^o 1, North fifty-five (55) degrees forty-seven (47) minutes East, nine hundred and twenty-nine and five tenths ($929 \frac{5}{10}$) feet to Corner N^o 2, a Post marked "N^o 2 U.S. Survey N^o 143."

Thence South twenty-seven (27) degrees fifteen (15) minutes West, eight hundred and sixty (860) feet to Corner N^o 3, a Post marked "N^o 3 U.S. Survey N^o 143," on Northerly boundary of Survey N^o 97, patented to the Jackson Mining Company with its claim upon the Wilson Lode. Thence South eighty-six (86) degrees fifteen (15) minutes West, fifty-three (53) feet to Corner N^o 4, a Post marked "N^o 4

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U. S. Survey N^o 143, the same being Post N^o 4 of said Survey N^o 97. Thence South fifty-seven (57) degrees West one hundred (100) feet to corner N^o 5, a Post marked "N^o 5". U. S. Survey N^o 143. Thence North thirty-eight (38) degrees twenty-six (26) minutes West three hundred and eighty-two and nine tenths (382 $\frac{9}{10}$) feet to the place of beginning, containing five (5) acres of land, more or less, as represented by yellow shading in the following plat.

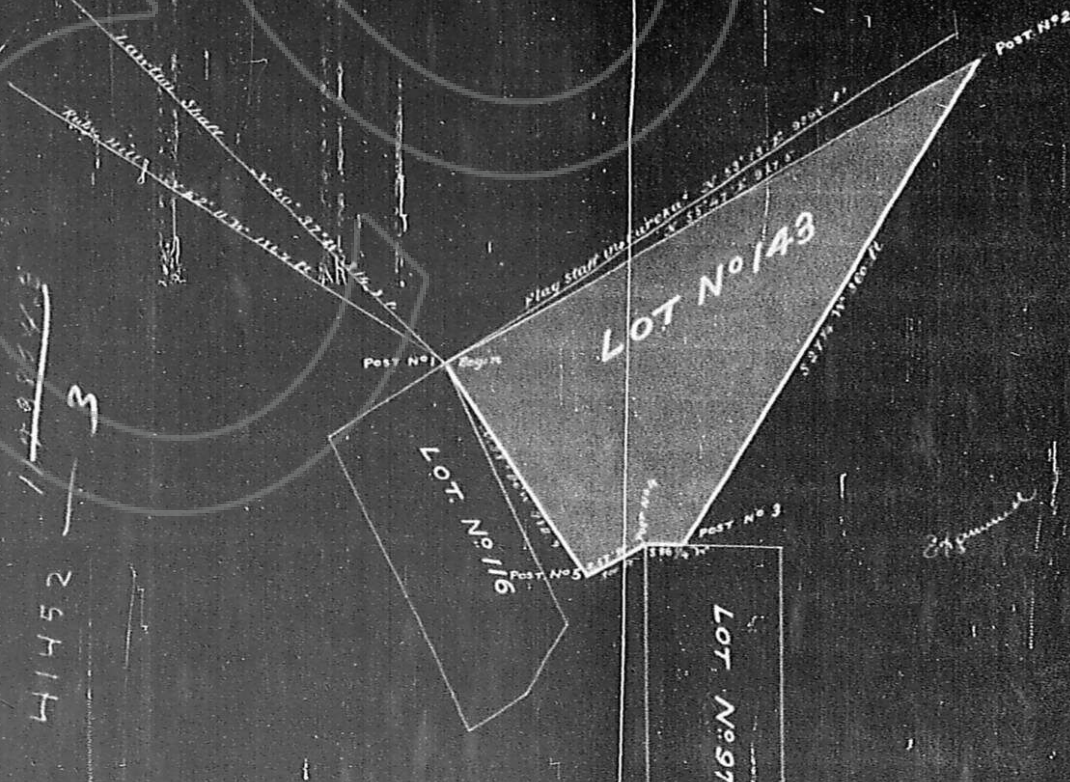

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Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with said Revised Statutes of the United States, Have given and Granted and by these presents Do Give and Grant unto the said _____

Phoenix Silver Mining Company,

and to its successors and assigns, the said premises above described as Lot number 143, embracing a portion of the surveyed public domain, with the exclusive right of possession and enjoyment of all the land included within the exterior lines of said survey not herein expressly excepted from these presents.

To Have and To Hold said Mill Site or premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said _____

Phoenix Silver Mining Company

and to its successors and assigns forever, subject nevertheless to the following conditions and stipulations:

First. That the premises hereby conveyed may be entered by the proprietor of any vein or lode of quartz, or other rock in place, bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, for the purpose of extracting and removing the ore from such vein, lode or deposit, should the same or any part thereof be

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found to penetrate, descend, pass through, or dip into the premises hereby granted.

Second. - That the premises hereby conveyed shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of courts.

Third. - That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress the Legislature of Nevada may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to the complete development thereof.

In testimony whereof, J. Rutherford B. Hayes, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
