

# NOTICE OF LOCATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the undersigned located and now claim Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet in length along this vein or lode containing valuable minerals, together with Three Hundred (300) feet in width on each side of the middle of said vein at the surface, and all veins, lodes, mineral and surface ground within the lines of this claim, the general course of said vein or lode running 1490 feet northerly and 10 feet westerly from the discovery monument on which this claim is posted. Beginning 750 feet south of the discovery monument, at the south end center monument, and running thence west 300 feet to s. w. corner monument No. 1; thence north 1500 feet to n. w. corner monument No. 2; thence east 300 feet and parallel to the south end line to the north end center monument; thence east 300 feet and parallel to said end line to n. e. corner monument No. 3; thence south 1500 feet to s. w. corner monument No. 4; thence west 300 feet to place of beginning; including all dips, spurs, angles and variations.

Diagram of Claim—The location (discovery point) and corner monuments should be designated on the accompanying diagram to make the Record of claim more perfect.

A mining claim must not exceed 1500 feet in length along the vein or lode, by 600 feet in width, 300 feet on each side of center of vein at surface.

No location of a mining claim can be made until the discovery of the vein or lode within the limits of the ground claimed.

The claim must be distinctly marked on the ground, so its boundaries can be readily traced.

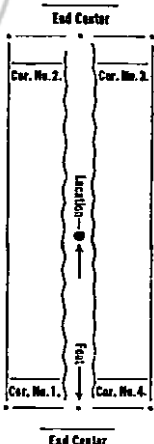
A severe penalty is provided by law for removing or defacing the stakes or monuments of a mining claim.
