

Certificate of Location

THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the 11 & G No. 13 lode mining claim was located by John P. Gergen on the 15th day of October, 1959.

The general course of said lode or vein is Northwesterly and southeasterly.

The claim is situated in the Alto Mining District, Esmeralda County, State of Nevada, T. 24 N., R. 21 E.

The locator claim is feet in a(n) S. 55° E. direction and 1075 feet in a(n) N. 55° W. direction from the point of discovery, with a width of 300 feet on each side of the center of the vein or lode along the entire length of said claim.

The dimensions and locations of the discovery work done on the claim are as follows: Access roads and drill holes prepared over a continuous group of fifty sites. The work for a continuous group of ten claims to date on H & G No. 12 and No. 13 and No. 14 for a group consisting of H & G No. 11 through No. 20.

The corners and side centers of the claim are located and marked as follows: The northern corner is marked by a 4 x 4 x 4' post inscribed in corner of the H & G No. 13; the northwest corner is marked by a 4 x 4' x 4' post inscribed in corner of the H & G No. 13; the northeast corner is marked by a 4 x 4' x 4' post inscribed in corner of the H & G No. 13; the southeast corner is marked by a 4 x 4' x 4' post inscribed in corner of the H & G No. 13. There is also a 4 x 4' x 4' post at the center of each side line.

Each of the above-described monuments is a 4' x 4' x 4' post buried and set in the ground.

All location and discovery work necessary to complete this location had been performed by John P. Gergen 11/1, 1959.
