

Certificate of Location

THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the RIPPER # 15 lode mining claim was located by Joseph L. Mabey on the 30th day of JUNE, 1970.

The general course of said lode or vein is Westerly and Easterly

The claim is situated in the Diamond Mining District, of Eureka County, State of Nevada, Northerly of Azimuth Mark U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey Bench Mark 8 AA. USGS monument on the Westerly and Southerly side.

The locator claims 1500 feet in a(n) Easterly direction and 300 feet in a(n) Westerly direction from the point of discovery, with a width of 300 feet on each side of the center of the vein or lode along the entire length of said claim.

The dimensions and locations of the discovery work done on the claim are as follows: A shaft 4' x 10' sunk approximately 10' deep at the point of claim discovery -- approximately 5000 NORTHERLY feet from the Whittaker workings.

The corners and side centers of the claim are located and marked as follows: Ripper # 15 starting from the point of beginning at the Whittaker workings 5000 NORTHERLY feet to location of Ripper # 14 300' Southerly to the S.W. corner of Ripper # 15 thence 750' Easterly thence 750' Easterly thence 300' Northerly thence 300' Northerly thence 750' Westerly thence 750' Westerly thence 300' Southerly to point of beginning. — THE RIPPER CLAIMS # 1 THRU # 16 AND # 17 THRU # 32 ARE CONTIGUOUS

Each of the above-described monuments is A cedar post 4" x 4" x 4'6" above the ground in accordance with the mining laws of the State of Nevada.
