REPORT ON GEOCHEMICAL SURVEY, W-20 to W-27 Claims

A geochemical survey of the W-20 to W-27 Claims, inclusive, was conducted, starting during August, 1970, which showed strong mercury and heavy metals anomalies. The current survey, using a more detailed sampling pattern, was designed to supplement the previous work. Soil samples were taken in the anomalous areas on 50 to 100' stations along lines 100' apart. In addition, test lines were run with a vertical field magnetometer and self potential gear. The work was performed by W. L. Wilson and A. K. Wilson, Jr.

The basic findings from such studies were:

1. The mercury anomaly previously reported was defined in greater detail.
2. The heavy metals anomaly previously reported was also defined in greater detail.
3. The test lines run with the magnetometer and self-potential gear did not appear to give useful data over the geochemical anomalies.

This survey was non-repetitive of any previous known work, and did further the exploration and development of each claim in said group.

The writer, W. L. Wilson, who supervised the above survey, has been Exploration Manager for Idaho Mining Corporation for 12 years, and previous to that was employed in the mining and mineral exploration business for 6 years.
