REPORT ON GEOCHEMICAL SURVEY,
RAMBLER NO. 1, RAMBLER NO. 2
and GOSSAN CLAIMS

A geochemical survey of the Rambler Nos. 1 and 2 and the Gossan Claim was conducted, starting on July 2, 1970, and continuing through September 17, 1970 as assessment work for 1969-1970. The survey currently being reported consisted of extending soil sample traverse lines, where needed, supplemental lines, where needed, and rock chip sampling within the anomalous zones. The soil samples were analyzed, as before, for mercury and heavy metals. The rock chip samples were analyzed for gold, silver, arsenic and mercury. The work was done by W. L. Wilson, A. K. Wilson, Jr., and Skyline Labs, Inc.

The basic findings from such studies were:

1. The mercury anomaly previously reported was delineated.
2. The rock chip samples showed high values for mercury and arsenic, and anomalous gold within the area reported as anomalous in 1 above.
3. There appears to be a good correlation between the amount of mercury in soils and the amount of mercury in rocks in a given area.

This survey was non-repetitive of any previous known work, and did further the exploration and development of each claim in said group.

The writer, W. L. Wilson, who supervised the above survey, has been Exploration Manager for Idaho Mining Corporation for 12 years, and previous to that was employed in the mining and mineral exploration business for 6 years.
