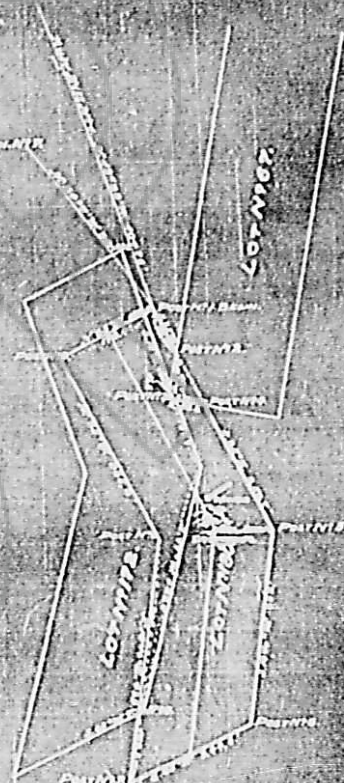

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Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration
of the premises, and in conformity with the prior Revised
Statutes of the United States, Ralph Keen and Granten and
by these presents do give and grant, unto the said

Joseph Mendenhall and H. B. McKim

and to their heirs, and assigns, the following premises
hereinbefore described as Lot No 180, embracing a portion of
the unincorporated public domain with the exclusive right of
possession and enjoyment of all the land included within
the exterior line of said survey, not however, as to, or extent
from these premises, and except hundred (100) linear feet of the
said back-spring river, bridge, ledge, or deposit for its length herein
before described, then along its entire depth, although being
within the land adjoining, and also of all other river, ledge, ledge,
or deposit that pass over its entire depth, the top or apex of
which lies inside the exterior line of said survey at the surface
extended downwards vertically, although such river, ledge,
ledge, or deposit is then determined as necessary for deposit
from a perpendicular to extend to the entire side
lines of said survey. Provided, that the right of possession
hereby granted to such entire parts of said river, ledge, ledge,
or deposit shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie
between vertical planes drawn downwards through the
lines of said survey to the surface, so continued in their
own direction that such vertical planes were intersected
by the surface of each exterior part of said river, ledge, ledge, or deposit.
And provided further, that nothing in this conveyance
shall be construed to authorize the grantee herein, their heirs or assigns to
sell or otherwise dispose of the surface of a mining claim or of a mineral
discovery made by another. To Have and to hold the premises

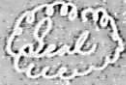
