Report on Geochemical Survey for Claims  
RC #1, RC #2, RC #3, RC #4

A geochemical survey of the above listed unpatented mining claims was conducted from July 1983 to August 1983. This survey was a western extension of the geochemical survey performed in 1982. Rock chip samples were taken from outcrops at 150 foot spacings along east west lines, with rows 150 feet apart. All samples were assayed for gold, silver, lead, zinc and arsenic by Bondar-Clegg Inc. in Lakewood, Colorado.

The results of this survey were:

- 1). Gold - a localized anomalous area was found in the southwest portion of RC #2 and the southeast portion of RC #1
- 2). Silver - the only anomalous area for silver was in the central part of RC #1
- 3). Lead - generally, only low values were found, no high anomalous areas
- 4). Zinc - anomalous zinc values were found in the following areas:
  - (a). the southeastern portion of RC #1
  - (b). the northeastern portion of RC #4
  - (c). the east central portion of RC #4
- 5). Arsenic - anomalous arsenic values were found to correlate with the anomalous gold values. In addition, anomalous arsenic values were also found in the central portion of RC #1.

This survey was non-repetitive of any previously known work, and did benefit the exploration and development of each claim in this group.

This work was carried out by Robert G. Pate and Anne E. Pate, qualified experts in the field of mining and exploration for 8 years.
