1. He is the person who directed the performance of the labor and the making of the improvements herein described.

2. Greystone Minerals Corporation, by agreement with Charleen F. Mee, holds the unpatented mining claims situated in Eureka County, Nevada, described as follows:

3. Greystone Minerals Corporation caused to be performed in or for the benefit of said mining claims the labor and improvements required by law for the assessment year ending 12:00 o'clock Meridian September 1, 1984.

4. The said labor and improvement consisted of a geochemical survey upon and within the boundaries of the claim group. The geochemical survey was performed by and under the direction of M. C. Godbe, III, 1012 Newhouse Building, Salt Lake City, Utah, Consulting Geologist, holding degrees from the University of Utah and having more than 30 years experience in the fields of geology and geoscience; and Jack W. Madsen, 66 North 10th West, Provo, Utah, Consulting Geologist, holding degrees from the Brigham Young University and having more than 30 years experience in the fields of geology and geoscience.

The basic findings of the geochemical survey including analysis of samples for constituent minerals were:

(a) Indicator gangue minerals as well as primary minerals sought are present in anomalous amounts along predictable projections from known mineral emplacement sources.

(b) Conditions similar to other known mineralized properties in the area occur within the boundaries of the claim group.

5. The said labor was performed and improvements made between September 1, 1983 and August 31, 1984.

6. At least Eleven Hundred Dollars (\$1,100.00) were paid for said labor and improvements which were performed at the instance and request of Greystone Minerals Corporation.

7. The above named unpatented claims comprise a contiguous group of mining claims in common; the said labor was performed and improvements made as a part of a general plan of development, and tend to improve and develop each and all of the mining claims in the group.
