- Sec. 1. Rentals—Rentals shall be paid to proper office of lessor in advance of each lease year.

If all or part of a neacompetitive leasehold is determined to be within a known geological structure or a favorable petroleum geological province, annual renat shall become \$2.00, be gunung with the lease year following notice of such determination.
