POWER OF ATTORNEY ON FILE IN QUALIFICATION Agent LEASE TERMS

Sec. 1. Rentals—Rentals shall be paid to proper office of lessor in advance of each lease year. Annual rental rates per sere or fraction thereof are:

- (a) Simultaneous noncompetitive lease, \$1.00 for the first 5 years, thereafter, \$3.00;
- Regular noncompetiti e lease, \$1.00:

(c) Competitive lease, \$2.00; or (d) Other, see attachment.

If all or part of a noncompetitive leasehold is determined to be within a known geological structure or a favorable petroleum geological province, annual rental shall become \$2.00, beginning with the lease year following notice of such determination. However, a lease that would otherwise be subject to trental of more than \$2.00 shall common to be subject to the higher rental.

If this lease or a portion thereof is committed to an approved cooperative or unit plan which includes a well capable of producing leased resources, and the plan commits a provision for allocation of production, royalties shall be paid on the production allocated to this lease. However, annual rentals shall continue to be due at the rate specified in (a), (b), (c), or (d) for those lands not within a participating area.

Failure to pay annual rental, if due, on or before the amiversary date of this lease (or next official working day if office is closed) shall automatically terminate this lease by operation of law. Rentals may be waived, reduced, or suspended by the Secretary upon a sufficient showing

Sec. 2. Royalties—Royalties shall be paid to proper office of lessor. Royalties shall be computed in accordance with regulations on production removed or sold. Royalty rates are:

- (a) Simultaneous poncompetitive lease, 12%%;
- (b) Regular noncompetitive lease, 1244;
- (c) Competitive lease, see anachment; or

Lessor reserves the right to specify whether royalty is to be paid in value or in kind, and the right to establish reasonable minimum values on products after giving lessee notice and an opportunity to be heard. When paid in value, royalties shall be due and payable on the last day of the month following the month in which production occurred. When paid in kind, production shall be delivered, unless otherwise agreed to by lessor, in merchantable condition on the premises when produced without cost to lessor. Lessee shall not be required to hold such production in storage beyond the last day of the month following the month in which production occurred, nor shall lessee be held liable for loss or destruction of royalty oil or other products in storage from causes beyond the reasonable control of lessee.

Minimum royalty shall be due for any lesse year after diconvery in which provalty payments.

Minimum royalty shall be due for any lesse year after discovery in which royalty payments aggregate less than \$1.00 per acre. Lessee shall pay such difference at end of tease year. This minimum royalty may be waived, suspended, or reduced, and the above royalty rates may be reduced, for all or portions of this lease if the Secretary determines that such action is necessary to encourage the greatest ultimate recovery of the leased resources, or it otherwise justified. An interest charge shall be assessed on late royalty payments or underpayments in accordance with the Federal Oil and Gas Royalty Management Act of 1982 (FOGRMA) (96 Stat. 2447). Lessee shall be liable for royalty payments on oil and gas lost or waited from a lease site when such loss or waste is due to negligence on the part of the operator, or due to the failure to comply with any rule, regulation, order, or citation issued order FOGRMA or the leasing sotherity.

Sec. 3. Bonds-Lessee shall file and maintain any bord required under regulations.

- Sec. 4. Diligence, rate of development, unitization, and drainage—Lessee shall exercise reasonable diligence in developing and producing, and shall prevent unnecessary damage to, loss of, or waste of leased resources. Lessor reserves right to specify rates of development and production in the public interests and to require lessee to subscribe to a cooperative or unit plan, within 30 days of notice, if deemed necessary for proper development and operation of area, field, or pool embracing these leased lands. Lessee shall drill and produce wells necessary to protect leased lands from drainage or pay compensatory royalty for drainage in amount determined by lessor. determined by lessor.

 Sec. 5. Documents, evidence, and inspection—Lessee shall file with proper office of lessor, not later than 30 days after effective date thereof, any contract or evidence of other arrangement for sale or disposal of production. At such times and in such form as lessor may prescribe, lessee shall furnish detailed statements showing amounts and quality of all products removed and sold, proceeds therefrom, and amount used for production purposes or unavoidably lost. Lessee may be required to provide plats and schematic diagrams showing development work and improvements, and reports with respect to parties in interest, expenditures, and depreciation costs. In the form prescribed by lessor, lessee shall keep a daily drilling record, a log, information on well surveys and tests, and a record of subsurface investigations and furnish copies to lessor when required. Lessee shall keep open at all reasonable times for inspection by any surforized officer of lessor, the lessed premises and all wells, improvements, machinery, and fammes thereon. when required. Lessee shall keep open at all reasonable times for inspection by any numerical officer of lessor, the leased premises and all wells, improvements, machinery, and futures thereon, and all books, accounts, maps, and records relative to operations, surveys, or investigations on or in the leased lands. Lessee shall maintain copies of all contracts, sales agreements, accounting records, and documentation such as billings, invoices, or similar documentation and as a billings, invoices, or similar documentation and as a billings.

Conduct of operations—Lessee thall conduct operations in a transact that minimizes adverse impacts to the Lend, sir, and water, so cultural, biological, visual, and other resources, and to sec. o. Lessee shall take reasonable measures deemed necessary by leasor to accomplish the intent of this section. To the extent consistent with lease rights granted, such measures may include, but are not limited to, modification to trings or design of facilities, trining of operations, and specification of enterin and final reclamation ansature. Leasor reserves the right to continue existing uses and to suthorize future uses upon or in the leased lands, including the approval of easements or rights-of-ways. Such uses shall be conditioned so as to prevenuescessary or unreasonable interference with rights of leases.

Prior to disturbing the surface of the leased lands, leases shall contact leasor to b of procedures to be followed and modifications or reclamation means of procedures to be followed and modifications or reclamation measures that may be mocessary.

Artast to be disturbed may require inventories or special studies to determine the extent of impacts to other resources. Lessee may be required to complete minor inventories or short term special studies under guidelines provided by lessor. If in the conduct of operations, threatened or endangered species, objects of historic or accentific interest, or substantial manufacines devironmental effects are observed, lessee shall immediately contact lessor. - Sec. 7. Mining operations—To the extent that impacts from mining operations would be substantially different or greater than those associated with normal drilling operations, leasor reserves the right to deny approval of such operations.
- Sec. 8. Extraction of belium—Lessor reserves the option of extracting or baving extracted helium from gas production in a manner specified and by messa provided by lessor at so expense or loss to lessee or owner of the gas. Lessee shall include in any contract or sale of gas the provisions of this section.
- Sec. 9. Damages to property—Lessee shall pay lessor for damage to lessor's improvements, and shall save and hold lessor harmless from all claims for damage or harm to persons or properry as a result of lease operations.
- Sec. 10. Protection of diverse interests and equal opportunity—Lessee shall: pay when the all states legally assessed and levied under laws of the State or the United States; accord all employees complete freedom of purchase; pay all wages at least twice each month in lawful money of the United States; maintain a safe working environment in accordance with standard industry practices; and take measures necessary to protect the health and safety of the public.

Lessor reserves the right to ensure that production is sold at reasonable prices and to preve monopoly. If lessee operates a pipeline, or owns controlling interest in a pipeline or a co-operating a pipeline, which may be operated accessible to oil derived from these lessed lessee shall comply with section 28 of the Mineral Lessing Act of 1920.

- Sec. 11. Transfer of lease interests and relinquishment of lease—As required by regalations, lessee shall file with leasor any assignment or other transfer of an interest in this lease. Lessee may relinquish this lease or any legal subdivision by filing in the proper office a written relinquishment, which shall be effective as of the date of filing, subject to the continued obligation of the lessee and surety to pay all accrued rentals and royalties.
- Sec. 12. Delivery of premises—At such time as all or portions of this lesse are retarned to lesson lesson shall place affected wells in condition for suspension or abundonment, reclaim the land as specified by lessor and, within a reasonable period of time, remove equipment as improvements not deemed necessary by lessor for preservation of producible wells.
- Sec. 13. Proceedings in case of default—If lessee fails to comply with any provisions of this lease, and the noncompliance continues for 30 days after written notice thereof, this lease shall be subject to cancellation. Lessee shall also be subject to applicable provisions and penalties of FOGRMA (96 Sur. 2447). However, if this lease includes laid known to contain valuable deposits of feased resources; it may be cancelled only by judicial proceedings. MULE DEER SPECIAL STIPULATION

The following described lands have been identified as critical habitat for wintering herds of mule deer. Therefore, prior to entry onto the lands within the described area, the lessee (operator) will discuss the proposed activities with the appropriate Bureau of Land Management's authorized officer who may require additional measures for the protection of mule deer. Such measures may include:

- Restriction of activity in identified areas during the winter months of November through March;
- b. No surface occupancy of selected sites;
- c. Special reclamation techniques.

Description of Lands

Parcel NV-126 is subject to this stipulation.

This limitation does not apply to maintenance and operation of producing wells. Exceptions to this limitation, in any year, may be specifically authorized in writing by the Bureau of Land Management's authorized officer.
