- x. 1. Rentals—Rentals shall be paid to proper office of lessor in advance of each lease yeared rates per acre or fraction thereof are.
 - (a) Simultaneous noncompetitive lease, \$1.00 for the first 5 years, thereafter, \$3.00; (b) Regular noncompetitive lease, \$1.00; (c) Competitive lease, \$2.00; or (d) Other, see attachment.

Proceedings in case of default—If lessee fails to comply with any provisions of this lesse, and the noncompliance continues for 30 days after written notice thereof, this lesse shall be subject to cancellation. Lessee shall also be subject to applicable provisions and penalties of FOCRMA 10% Stat. 24317, However, if this lesse includes land known to contain valuable deposits of leased resources, it may be cancelled only by judicial proceedings. This provision shall not be construed to prevent the exercise by lessor of any other legal and equitable remedy, including waiter of the default. Any such remedy or waiver shall not prevent liner cancellation for the same default occurring at any other time.
