

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: 132065


The undersigned hereby certifies that he has located the AFGAN-EXT  
No. 102 lode mining claim in Eureka County, in  
the State of Nevada, on the 1 day of February, 1990.  
This claim is located in the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Quarter of Section 20,  
Township T22N, Range S11 East, Mount Diablo Base  
and Meridian. This claim is 1500 feet in length and the width is  
600 feet with 300 feet on each side of the center of the claim. On  
the center line of the claim, the notice of location is posted at the  
point of discovery from which 50 feet is claimed in a North  
direction and 1450 feet in a South direction which is  
the general course of the lode deposit and premises.


The claim is referred to some natural object or permanent monument and  
described by metes and bounds as follows, to wit:

Beginning at corner 1; whence The NW Corner of Sec 20, T22N, RS1E  
MDBM bears about 280°, approximately 2,550 feet;  
thence 180°, 750 feet to corner 2, marked A-EXT-102 1/2;  
thence 180°, 750 feet to corner 3, marked A-EXT-102 1/3;  
thence 270°, 600 feet to corner 4, marked A-EXT-102 1/4;  
thence 0°/360°, 750 feet to corner 5, marked A-EXT-102 1/5;  
thence 0°/360°, 750 feet to corner 6, marked A-EXT-102 1/6;  
thence 90°, 600 feet to corner 1, the point of beginning,  
marked A-EXT-102 1/1.

The corners of this claim are marked by 4 x 4 inch wooden posts, native  
timber, 4 inch diameter PVC pipe or rock monuments with metal tags  
inscribed with the appropriate corner numbers. Location work consisted  
of making the maps in accordance with NRS 517.040, which have been  
transmitted to the County Recorder with this certificate of location.
