NANCY J. WOLVERSON, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. That she is an agent for Amax Gold Exploration, Inc., a Delaware corporation qualified to do business in the State of Nevada, with offices at 350 Indiana Street, Golden, Colorado 80401.

2. That this affidavit is made on behalf of the current owners of the unpatented claims ("Claims") more fully described in Exhibit A attached hereto and made part hereof.

3. That an aggregate of at least \$3,800.00 (equal to more than \$100.00 total expenditure per claim) worth of work and improvements was performed upon or for the benefit of each and all of the said claims as a contiguous group under a common plan of evaluation and development for the assessment year ending September 1, 1990, for the purpose of complying with the laws of the United States of America and the State of Nevada pertaining to annual assessment work and holding the said claims. Rock Blvd., Reno, Nevada 89502, and the analytical work was performed by Bondar-Clegg Inc., 625 Spice Island Drive, Sparks, Nevada 89431.

5. That approximately 15 days were spent on such labor and that the labor was performed in the period between July 23 and July 30, 1990, July 1 and July 6, 1990, and August 31, 1990 as part of an ongoing work program.

6. That the labor was performed and improvements were made on behalf of the individual claim owners and Equinox Resources, Inc., as lessee of said claims, at the expense of Amax Gold Exploration, Inc., under the supervision of affiant and that the total expenditures for the labor and improvements exceeded \$3,850.00.

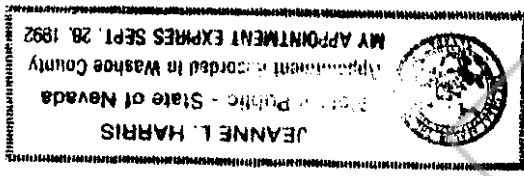

SUMMARY REPORT  
Geological and Geochemical Surveys  
as Assessment work on the  
Pete 200-219, 227-244  
Eureka County, Nevada

A) During the period June 23-30, July 1 and 6 and August 31, 1990, geological and geochemical surveys were conducted on the Pete claims described above. The entire claim block was mapped and geochemical sampling was distributed as shown on the attached map.

B) The surveys were designed specifically to determine the existence, extent, and possible controls of precious metal mineralization. Total cost of the work exceeded \$3,800.00.

C) Results of the survey confirms the existence of trace amounts of gold and anomalous amounts of the pathfinder elements As, Hg and Ba.

D) The surveys were conducted by the following consultants and Amax personnel:

Clifford R. Lippitt, 2 Fairmount Park East, Bangor, Maine 04401. Mr. Lippitt has a M.S. in Geochemistry from the Colorado School of Mines and over 10 years of experience in exploration geology.

John K. Zerwick, Rajazer Resources Inc., 6936 W. 71st Ave., Arvada, Colorado 80003. Mr. Zerwick has a B.S. in Geology from the University of Wisconsin and over 20 years of experience in mineral exploration.

Nancy J. Wolverson, geologist, Amax Gold Exploration Inc., 350 S. Rock Blvd., Ste. E, Reno, Nevada 89502. She has a M.S. in Geology from the University of Nevada and 10 years of experience in mineral exploration.
