Anthony P. Taylor, being first duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. I am the President of Great Basin Exploration and Mining Company, Inc., a Nevada corporation, whose business address is 3400 Kauai Court, Suite 208, Reno, Nevada 89509. I am more than 18 years of age and am personally familiar with the group of mining claims described in the attached Exhibit A, situated in Eureka County, Nevada, the location notices of which are recorded in the official records of Eureka County, Nevada. Said claims are owned by H.W. and Mimi Schull, and A. Englebright and R. Martin, subject to a Mineral Lease with Option to Purchase, dated August 1, 1990 with H.W. Schull.

During the period of August 21, 1990 through August 31, 1990, at least \$10,000 worth of work and improvements was performed upon said claims, which equates to at least \$100 worth of work and improvements on each of the said claims. In addition, sampling was completed on the claims, which work tends to evaluate, improve and develop each of the said claims and is part of a general plan of evaluation, improvement and development of the claims.

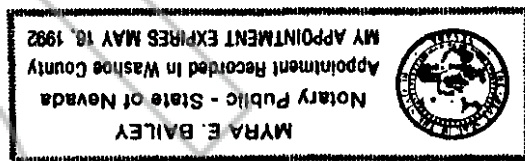

Geophysical and Geochemical Survey Report

This report has been prepared in compliance with the requirements of 30 U.S.C., 28-1 as assessment work for the year ending at noon on September 1, 1990, for the unpatented mining claims listed and described in Exhibit A (the "Subject Claims"), which claims are located in Nye County, Nevada. The report describes a geophysical and geochemical survey program conducted on the Subject Claims during June 1, 1990 through September 1, 1990, by experts qualified by education or experience in their respective fields.

The geophysical and geochemical assessment work related to each and every one of the Subject Claims, which claims are contiguous to one another. The work was conducted on behalf of and at the expense of Great Basin Exploration and Mining Company, Inc., owner of a leasehold interest in the Subject Claims. The work was done on the Subject Claims, and has not been applied as labor for more than two consecutive years or for more than a total of five years on any one of the Subject Claims.

The work consisted of geophysical ground surveys, rock chip sampling, geophysical mapping, geological mapping, geochemical analyses, and related field work. The geophysical surveys consisted of approximately 19,500 feet of IP resistivity measurements on 800-foot dipole spacings. A sketch of the survey lines in relation to the Subject Claims is attached as Exhibit B-1. The work was performed by Great Basin Exploration and Mining Company, Inc., Cooksley-Young Geophysical Contractors, and American Assay Lab. A total of more than \$10,000 was expended in performing the work.

The survey showed that areas of alteration can be distinguished from unaltered rock and that structures, such as faults, can also be distinguished. This information will guide future exploration activities.

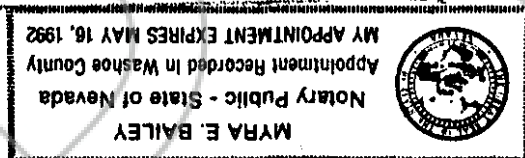
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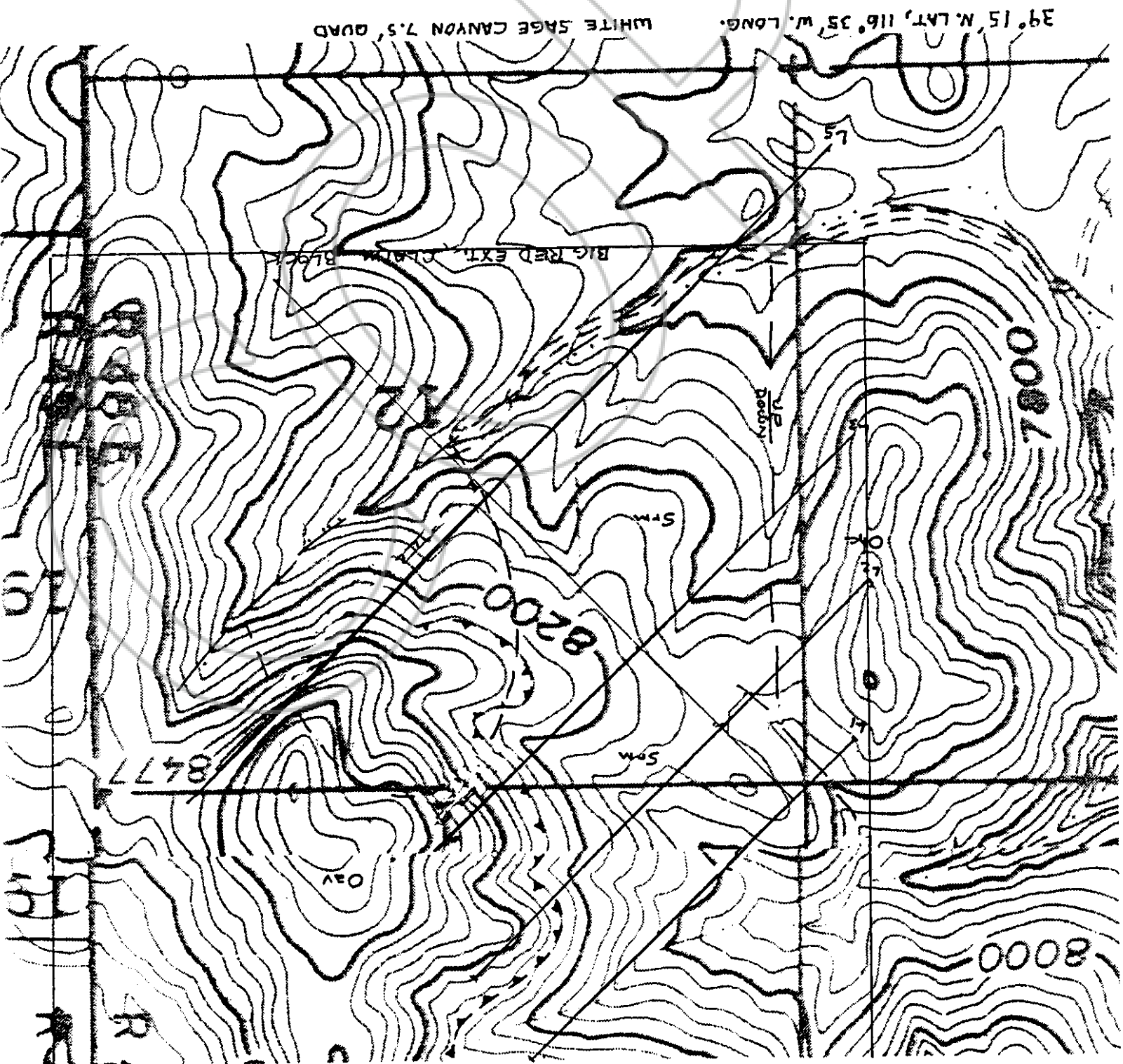
