NOW KNOW YE, that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto Barrick Goldstrike Mines Inc., a Colorado corporation, the lands described above; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said lands with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Barrick Goldstrike Mines Inc., a Colorado corporation, its successors and assigns, forever; and

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING TO THE UNITED STATES:

1. A right-of-way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. Act of August 30, 1890 (43 U.S.C. 945); and

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patented real property, and any clean-up response, natural resource damage or other actions related in any manner to said solid or hazardous substances or wastes. This covenant shall be construed as running with the patented real property, and may be enforced by the United States in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Pursuant to the requirements of 42 U.S.C. 9620(3), Notice is given that a complete search of the agency and Barrick Goldstrike Mines Inc. files reveals that the materials listed below have been stored on the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 24, T. 36 N., R. 49 E., MDM, located within the South Block Waste Rock Disposal Area, Parcel A.

The materials were stored at the Bazza Substation and within an associated storage facility. The substation contains 5 transformers: Serial Numbers 1477, 7192, 02324-1, 02361-1, and 02362-1, all of which are free of PCBs, except Serial Number 02362-1 which was manufactured prior to PCB restrictions of 1978 and may contain PCBs.

The potentially hazardous substances stored within the associated storage facility are listed based on Material Safety Data Sheets and include:

The tailings impoundment area also includes return water pipelines, a seepage sump control system, and a backup generator. All components are subject to a zero discharge permit issued by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection. As of November 1994, the operation was in compliance with the permit.

The seepage pump control system is located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 18, T. 36 N., R. 50 E., MDM.

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In addition, five electrical transformers, Serial Numbers 7155, 7366, A2547, A2548, A2549, and PYL-0967, certified as non-PCB, are located at the seepage collection pond (3 transformers) within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 18; the North Block substation transformer is located within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 17, and the North Block Spill Containment transformer is located within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 17; all of which are located within T. 36 N., R. 50 E., MDM.
