THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, by the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1862 (12 Stat., 469), as amended by the Act of July 2, 1864 (13 Stat., 366), "to aid in the construction of a Railroad and Telegraph Line from the Minnesota River to the Pacific Ocean and to secure to the Government the use of the same for Postal, Military and other purposes," and the Act of July 3, 1865 (14 Stat., 79), authority is given to the Central Pacific Railroad Company to construct a Railroad and Telegraph Line, under certain conditions and stipulations as expressed in said acts, and provision is made for granting to the said company, "every alternate section of public land, designated by odd numbers, to the amount of ten alternate sections per mile on each side of said railroad, on the line thereof, and within the limits of twenty miles on each side of said road, not sold, reserved, or otherwise disposed of by the United States, and to which a pre-emption or homestead claim may not have attached at the time of said land," mineral land excluded; and

WHEREAS, it is further provided in said Act of July 2, 1864, that "the term 'mineral land', whenever the same occurs in this Act, and the Act to which this is an amendment, shall not be considered to include coal and iron lands;" and

WHEREAS, an official statement bearing date November 2, 1869, from the Secretary of the Interior, has been filed in the General Land Office, showing that the line of said Railroad and Telegraph, from Ogden, in the Territory of Utah, to Sacramento City, State of California, has been constructed and fully completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by the Acts aforesaid;
