States Federal government, grievances and protests with regard to gross violations of the treaty. Additionally, the Western Shoshone government continue diplomatic efforts with the United States government to enforce its own "Supreme Law of the Land" and for confirmation and recognition of Western Shoshone sovereignty, land area, natural resources and basic human rights. Diplomatic efforts to date have not succeeded but these diplomatic channels remain open. In an effort to clarify the position of the National Council, a Charter of Self-Government was presented to the Secretary General of the United Nations on December 15th, 1994. This document reaffirmed Western Shoshone Proclamation ≠-95 sovereignty to the world. It is to this end that the following is served.

the Treaty of Ruby Valley was not a treaty of cession, meaning that the Western Shoshones did not thereby cede their lands to the United States of America and,
