The causes in the above-captioned litigation, previously consolidated into single assigned case number 3543, were presented for trial on October 20, 2003 through October 27, 2003.

Appearing for plaintiff Lisa Mendez, as Administratrix of the Estates of Edward P. Kurtz and Lily M. Kurtz, decedents, was attorney Greg Corn. Appearing on behalf of plaintiff Angela Wong Kurtz were attorneys Gary Green and Randy Hall. Mr. Corn was also appearing on behalf of plaintiff Angela Wong Kurtz to satisfy the *pro hac vice* permission granted to Mr. Green and Mr. Hall to practice pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 42.

Defendants Jeffrey Allen Eastes and Watkins and Shepard Trucking, Inc. were represented by attorney Christian Moore.

A jury of eight persons was duly accepted and impaneled and sworn to try the case.

At the conclusion of plaintiffs' presentation of evidence, the Court granted defendants' NRCP 41(b) Motion to Dismiss all Claims Presented by Lisa Mendez, as Administratrix of the Estates of Edward P. Kurtz and Lily M. Kurtz, because all recoverable damages by the Estates have previously been satisfied by payments received by other settling defendants.

The claims of plaintiff Angela Kurtz were, after evidence was presented along with instructions of the Court and arguments of counsel, submitted to the jury who retired to deliberate their verdict. The jury subsequently returned to the Court the following general verdict which was accepted by the Court and entered on the record as follows:

We, the jury in the above-entitled action, find for the defendants JEFF EASTES and WATKINS AND SHEPARD TRUCKING, INC. and against the Plaintiffs.

KURTZ and LILY M. KURTZ, and ANGELA WONG KURTZ together with the taxable costs and attorneys' fees incurred by Defendants in this action as allowed by law.
