The Claim is approximately 1500 feet long and 600 feet wide, such that 10 feet are claimed in a North direction and 1490 feet in a South direction from the point of discovery (monument of location), at which the Notice of Location was posted, together with 300 feet on each side of the Location Monument and center line of the claim. The general course of the vein is from the North to the South Direction. The M&B description of the claim boundaries is:

Beginning at Corner No. 1, which is the Northwest Corner of this mining claim, thence East a distance of 600 feet to Corner No. 2, which is the Northeast Corner, thence South a distance of 1500 feet to Corner No. 3, which is the Southeast Corner, thence West a distance of 600 feet to Corner No. 4, which is the Southwest Corner, thence North a distance of 1500 feet to Corner No. 1, the point of beginning.

The Northwest Corner (No. 1) of this claim is approximately 1610 feet North and 11842 feet East of a rock cairn and t-post marking the southwest corner of Section 31 of T 25 N, R 52 E, MDB&M, i.e. the township corner. Measured Nad 27 L-L GPS position of said cairn is 39° 59' 48.92"N, 116° 09' 29.378"W, being 4 ft N and 3 ft W of record position per 1976 BLM protraction diagram.

All corners and the Location Monument of this claim are marked by a red-topped 1.5" x 1.5" x 4' wooden posts set one foot in the ground. Each corner monument is further identified by an aluminum tag on which the claim name and corner description are inscribed.

The work of location consists of preparing a claim map for recording as provided in NRS 517.040.
